

The coronavirus has already had, and will continue to have, a significant impact on our community and our daily lives.

Grand Prix Equine veterinarians are currently available, as always, 24/7 for your horse's medical appointments and emergency care. Horses are not able to contract and spread COVID-19, but their stall door, their halter and the other "touchable" areas of the barn are potential fomites for transmission. We will be taking the following steps to do our part to reduce the spread of Coronavirus:

- We will not be shaking hands with clients or staff as a greeting, and we will keep a 6' distance (as is humanly possible) from all humans at the farm.
- We will be wearing latex gloves to protect ourselves and your property. Our truck and medical equipment will be wiped clean with Clorox disinfecting wipes between barn visits.
- If you or a member of your household are sick with respiratory symptoms, please call to reschedule your appointment. If you have an emergency, please let us know ahead of time, and we will have trained technical help to handle your horse.
- Even if you have no respiratory symptoms, and especially if you are in a high risk category for disease, it would be ideal for you to have your horse(s) in their stalls for the appointment, and we can call you after performing our physical exam to discuss the treatment options.
- Alternatively, if you would prefer to reschedule your appointment for a later date, we would be happy to accommodate that request.
- If any of our staff become sick with respiratory signs, we will NOT come to your farm, and will call to reschedule. We hope you'll understand. Out of an abundance of caution Dr. Harry Werner will not be making farm calls at this time.
