California regulation banning licensees from unsanctioned racing set to go into effect Jan. 1

An update to California Horse Racing Board Rule 1902 aimed at discouraging participation in unsanctioned horse racing will go into effect Jan. 1. The rule deals with conduct detrimental to horse racing and will now include prohibition of "participation in or presence at any non-recognized race meeting where racing occurred."
